In some words, the **o** can make an /u/ sound. This is often when it is followed by an **n**, **v** or **th**.

u is the most common spelling of /u/ and is mostly used at the start or in the middle of words.

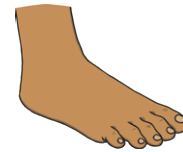

“What time is it?” they **asked.**

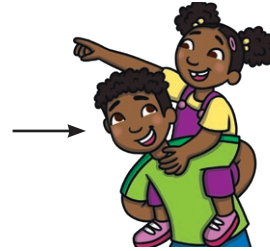
