School Uniform

A reminder that our school uniform is an identity unique to the children of St. James'. It gives us a sense of belonging and pride. Recently, we have noticed quite a few children who are wearing clothes that are not associated with the St. James' uniform. The policy is on the website, under the parent section about our uniform. Traditionally, St. James' has a 'winter' uniform and a 'summer' uniform. We would expect all children to be wearing our winter uniform now, with a guideline of October half term for the change of uniform.

Our winter uniform compromises of:

- White long or short sleeved blouse or shirt
- Green St. James' school tie available from Stevensons
- Courtelle bottle green V-neck St. James' jumper or cardigan available from Stevensons
- Bottle green pinafore dress (for Year R Year 4)
- Bottle green skirt (suggested for Year 5 and Year 6 short netball type skirts are not acceptable)
- Traditional styled grey trousers or shorts (for boys or girls)
- Long or short white or grey socks (trainer socks are not acceptable) or tights in grey or bottle green
- Warm practical waterproof coat or anorak, preferably in a single dark colour no logos
- Black sturdy practical school shoes (boots, trainers or high-heeled shoes are not permitted)
- Optional warm practical hat no logos

We do of course appreciate the cost of living, and school uniform is not cheap. The PSA provide a wonderful service with our pre-loved uniform exchange (limited amount in the office) and run sales after school on a regular basis, where you can pick up any item of school uniform for a fraction of the cost of Stevensons.







Christmas 'Give and Take' Boxes


Recently, some of our Year 6 children attended a Social Justice conference and they would love to organise a 'Give and take' box to support those in need in our community.


