Dear Parents/Carers

Well, that's that, no more school for 2023 - another year gone in the history of St. James' CE Primary. Next year, the school will be celebrate its 168<sup>th</sup> birthday. A lot has changed since 1856, children, staff, the community...but one thing has remained constant...Jesus Christ. Christmas must have been as magical in 1856 as it is now with the invention of Christmas cards, the first Christmas trees being introduced from Europe, the giving and receiving of presents and a Christmas feast. This was, and still is, a celebration of the birth of Jesus.

Jesus was both Man and God, but he was raised by two real human beings. I am blessed to be a father of Alisha, Jesse, Joel and Dotty, and I know the joy and difficulty of parenting little ones. Jesus would have said 'Abba' first to Joseph, although he was God's only son. Joseph was indeed special; he chose to follow God's will and listened to the angel. He raised Jesus (along with his other siblings), but ultimately knew that He was destined for greater things.

Our wonderful Year 2 children performed on stage at the Bournemouth Pavilion during the Bournemouth schools Christmas carol concert last month. # **School Uniform**

Another reminder that our school uniform is an identity unique to the children of St. James'. It gives us a sense of belonging and pride. Recently, we have noticed quite a few children who are wearing clothes that are not associated with the St. James' uniform. The policy is on the website, under the parent section about our uniform. Traditionally, St. James' has a 'winter' uniform and a 'summer' uniform. We would expect all children to be wearing our winter uniform now, with a guideline of October half term for the change of uniform.

# Our winter uniform compromises of:

- White long or short sleeved blouse or shirt
- Green St. James' school tie available from Stevensons
- Courtelle bottle green V-neck St. James' jumper or cardigan available from Https://www.Stevensons.co.uk
- Bottle green pinafore dress (for Year R Year 4)
- Bottle green skirt (suggested for Year 5 and Year 6 short netball type skirts are not acceptable)
- Traditional styled grey trousers or shorts (for boys or girls)
- Long or short white or grey socks (trainer socks are not acceptable) or tights in grey or bottle green
- Warm practical waterproof coat or anorak, preferably in a single dark colour no logos
- Black sturdy practical school shoes (boots, trainers or high-heeled shoes are not permitted)
- Optional warm practical hat no logos

We do of course appreciate the cost of living, and school uniform is not cheap. The PSA provide a wonderful service with our pre-loved uniform exchange (limited amount in the office) and run sales after school on a regular basis, where you can pick up any item of school uniform for a fraction of the cost of Stevensons.

# **End to End Encryption**

**CEOP** have released some advice for parents, young people and professionals following the recent decision by Meta to roll out end-to-end encryption on Facebook Messenger. The National Crime Agency are concerned that as a result of Meta's design choices, the company will no longer be able to see (child abuse) offending occurring on their messaging platform, and law enforcement will no longer be able to obtain this evidence from them.





James Babbage, Director General for Threats at the National Crime Agency says, "This problem won't go away if anything, it will likely get worse. Offenders will still use Facebook Messenger to send illegal material and will use the vast quantity of data shared on the platform about children to select and groom future victims."
