Dear Parents/Carers

We are now at the end of week 4 of Term 3, and only have two more weeks left until February Half Term. The days are flying by and the learning that is taking place is incredible. We see on a daily basis the growth of your children and the amazement at their limitless ability across all curriculum subjects.

We have parent consultations in Term 4 and we can't wait to share books and news about your children's progress.

One year ago, Ofsted visited us and judged us as being a 'Good' school. With the continued support of our Trust (DCAT), we are going from strength to strength and St. James' is a wonderful school to be part of. I am humbled and privileged to lead such a wonderful staff team and your children are in a great place.

lane Kelly from Portsmouth and Winchester Diocese came in last week and led a CPD session with our staff; she enjoyed looking around St. James' and was impressed with what she saw. Richard Wharton (Diocesan Education Advisor) is also visiting us next week. External validation is always nice, we know how fantastic our children are, and it's even better when someone else confirms it.

Early indications from BCP school admissions are that we will be full next year (for our Early Years cohort), with over 200 applicants naming us in their top 3 choices. This is encouraging during a low birth rate in the area, and affirming the good things that St. James' does for all children.

A Few Requests From The Office

Reporting of absence - please do this by 9am on the morning of each day, as per our attendance policy, either via Arbor, emailing the office (office@stjames.academy), or leaving a message on the telephone. If you haven't informed us of more than one day, you will need to let us know each morning. Unless children have a temperature, vomiting or diarrhoea, or are really too ill to come in, we are happy to have them. We can cope with a huge array of sniffles and grizzels!

Handwashing - with a variety of bugs around, please do highlight the importance of hand washing to your children. We all know how much of a difference washing hands properly can make to the spread of illness.

Lost property - please **name all** your child's clothing, we have increasing amounts of lost property left each day unnamed that we are unable to reunite with their owner!

Arbor - please have a look on Arbor to make sure we have all up-to-date information, including who is authorised to collect your child.

Post box - we do have a post box outside the office, and on the visitors gate. Please leave any paperwork that needs returning to the office in one of these, to save you queueing in the office.

Lunches - please remember to provide your child with a packed lunch if you haven't ordered a hot school lunch via Arbor. If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 you are entitled to Universal Free School Meals - but you do still need to order your childs meal choice in advance.
