One thing that stood out, was their selfless designs, all aimed at helping people and making the world a better and kinder place. We had a lovely day at Southampton University, looking at other children's designs and getting our awards.

What we didn't know was that one design would be selected to be made into a prototype by the team of engineers at Southampton University, and hopefully be used in the world of engineering. **Emily, from year 3**, designed a 'seed drone', and this has been chosen by a panel of experts as the winning design. It will be made into a tangible design and she will be celebrated at this year's award ceremony. Well done Emily, you are brilliant, we are all so proud of you.

We will be entering the competition again this year, where all of our children will be able to enter their design for the future.
