Draw/Make

Invent your own mythical creature- this can be made out of junk materials, clay, card etc.

Draw a picture of an imaginary Greek God.

Can you create a sculpture of a Spartan helmet, shield or Greek vase?

Create a 3D model of a Greek landmark. Write an explanation about what it is or a set of instructions as to how you made it!

Look at the British Museum website- choose one artefact and make a pencil sketch of it. Make sure to explain what it was used for!

Use Purple Mash to create an Ancient Greek video game or animation.

Create a mosaic that would be on the wall or floor of a Greek temple. What colours and designs should you choose?
